

NGĀI TAHU


- Ngāi Tahu has a tribal asset base of \$1.2 billion.

- Ngāi Tahu contributes over \$200 million to the South Island economy through job creation, purchasing and spending their profits locally.






NGĀPUHI


- Te Rūnanga ā-lwi o Ngāpuhi owns businesses in commercial property, fishing and social services.

NGĀTI POROU


- Ngāti Porou owns businesses in forestry, farming and fishing.
- Ngāti Porou have 48 marae and 58 hapū groupings.
- 9.5% of the Ngāti Porou workforce are employers or self-employed.






NGĀTI KAHUNGUNU

- Ngāti Kahungunu Incorporated owns businesses in farming and fishing.
- Ngāti Kahungunu Incorporated owns Tautāne Station which is located 65 km east of Dannevirke and covers 3680 hectares.
- Taratahi Agricultural Training Centre run farming training schools for 16–19 year olds on Tautāne Station throughout the year.




NGĀTI TOA RANGATIRA

- Ngāti Toa owns and runs Ora Toa Health Services in Porirua, and Wellington.
- Ora Toa services include: Tamariki Ora, Whānau Ora, Alcohol and Drug Services, Porirua Asthma Service, Diabetes Service, GP Clinic, Antenatal Education, Cervical Screening, Breast Screening and Education, Cancer Support and Nutrition and Exercise.



ĀTIHAUNUI-A-PĀPĀRANGI

- Ātihau-Whanganui Incorporation has assets worth over \$124 million.
- Ātihau-Whanganui Incorporation owns eight sheep and beef stations and 5000 acres of forests.
- Ātihau-Whanganui Incorporation offers sheep and beef farming training through Awhiwhenua Farm School.



WAIKATO-TAINUI

- Waikato-Tainui own businesses in property, education, fisheries and the environment.
